


### Communication, Language and Literacy

- Sharing achievements and 'Show and Tell' with the class




### Physical Development

### Knowledge and Understanding of the world


- Naming planets and talking about some of their features.

### Maths

Developing counting skills, including:

- that the last number in the count tells us 'how many' (cardinality),
- the need for 1:1 correspondence; understanding that anything can be counted, including actions and sounds
